1. Malcolm X Memorial Meetings: The branches may be interested in the program that is being planned for the Malcolm X Memorial Meeting in New York Feb. 23. We will be having a panel of black students who have been invited to speak on the influence of Malcolm X on black youth, especially campus youth. In addition, we will show the 22 minute film called "Malcolm X, Struggle for Freedom." The film can be rented from the Cinema 16 Library, 80 University Place, New York, N.Y. 10003. This is a part of Grove Press. Their number is (212) 989-6400. The film rents for \$22.50 plus \$.40 for insurance and possibly postage costs. They only have eight prints of the film.

2. Request from The Militant: Branches are requested to send in to The Militant reports on any activities commemorating the death of Malcolm X which are held in your area, including forums.

3. Paul Boutelle's Tour: When Paul Boutelle comes to your area on tour we would appreciate it if a comrade could be assigned to accompany him to his meetings and to write down the most common questions which are asked during the question periods. We hope to use these in preparing literature directed to the black community. The questions should be sent to the campaign committee.

4. Suggestion for Tour: One way of following up on contacts made during Paul Boutelle's campaign tour is to organize a class on Afro-American history or a Malcolm X tape series. Announcements of the class could be taken to meetings where Paul speaks. Such a series is being planned for New York.
