Ho says nothing sbout the soctel-imperielist policies of tha sti in the United Statas on porto Rico, of the gocial Deciocrecy colonita nolim cy in Jpain, Belsium, Franch(to name. only a fow ecustrics). Nor does he speculate on the revolutionery poten tialities of a party which has nothing conclustive to sey egainst its raform ist brothers in hanope and olsowhere.

He does exter into eviong discusse Ion of jacifisa, its impotence and treacheryb He ettecks the pecilifts Who lead lebor, like tho Weldmans, end oneals and their reformst counterm perts throughout the world. Not a mord (the exact whole truth) ebout Nomen Thoras, Devere All and end other of Burnhem's comreces, nore outspoken Iy preachors of cless and international peece then thoso ho nemes. nbove all he storns egeinist otalini sk and its social-petriotic orines politoly onfting roiorance to the setwe tes of the 3P. But nowhere in his easay will the rovolutionery worker as scover a word ebout the suprece instrument of the proleterfat egeinst capitalist war. the civil vect of the olasses. Nowhere the clear concise phrese of Lenin: "Revoluticnary Defeatisn". Nowhere the bettiodry of Karl thobknachth natho chiof onomy is at hama."

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## Comrades:

Six months ago the bulk of your faction entered the Socialist Party with the avoved purpose of "educating the leftwerd moving soci alist workers to revolutionary liarxism. Your leadership maintained that it was "theoretically possible to reform the 3.5. (June 1935 ilentm, Cannon Schachtman resolution?.

The price for this entry was enormous. You liquidated a party which only a year before had been established with 1,000 members, anidst the greatest enthusiasm of the whole advanced radical movement. You gave up your progrem. Xou gave up an independent veekly peper, the wew wilitant, after seven years of immense hardshins to estalish it, You gave up your the oretical orgen, the wew International.. Fou liquidated the largest and most militant unemployed organization in the United States, the Nationa 1 Unemployed Leagues. Iou broke up a cla ss strugele defense, league, the N.r.i4D. You stripped yourself of everything that could identify you as a distirect political force. You submerged your identity both organizationally and politically.

And your leadership told you that entry into the Socialist Party was worth even suct a price: A golden oproptunity.
But your entry immediately had the effect of arresting the develonment of the sections of the centrist left wirg. The niPA, which on 7 a short time ago was conducting negotiations with your leadership and planning to split, dissolved itself and went meekly into the "militart" caucus. "Heftward moving" leaders, like Gus Tyler, int roduced reformist resolutions making "the advocacy of armed insurrection incompatible with mernbership in the Socialist fartyin and calling fastead for the socialdemocratic formula "m intain and strengthen existing ciemocratic" (bourgeois) "institutions". The "militant" caucus cast overboard its draft program and revised tle old Detroit right wing program - to the riglt.
Instead of winting sincere workers for an indepe ndent revolutionary liarxist Party, you started an influx into a reformist party, the Sodialist Barty. (If such left-wingers as the Trotskyists enter the socialist Party, then of course the Socialist Party must he ve become revolutionary". Instead of weakening the reformist leaders like Thomas and Hoan you bolstered the mp to the point where today tle y control the whole party and all of its policies.
