Note: The "Group" was the Primary Party Unity of the United Communist Party. It theoretically was to consist of between no fewer than 5 (if possible) and no more than 10 members. It was to be headed by a "Group Organizer" elected by the group itself, who would be the individual in contact with the next higher level of party organization, the "Branch," which was to consist of not more than 10 groups. This structure was intended to make the UCP resistant to penetration by spies and mass arrests resulting therefrom.

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
