Notes:

1. The above series is that of "dues actually collected" — dues stamps sold each month in each district. It does not capture that percentage of active party members in dues arrears in any given month, which may be conceptualized as a relatively fixed number continually "rolling over" — with one set of members paying up their back dues at the same moment a new crop of tardy members moves into arrears; nor does it capture that percentage of unemployed party members making use of the "exempt" stamps to which they were entitled. Under party rules, District Organizers were entitled to apply for free "exempt" stamps in quantity of up to 10% of the dues stamps sold in the previous month. While it would be a minor mistake to assume that these figures should be mechanically adjusted 10% upwards to compensate for these exempt stamps, neither should these active party members be ignored. Be advised that this membership series, while official, nevertheless is an understatement of true party size.

2. The Armenian Federation became the 18th language section of the WPA in 1924. A unity convention was held Feb. 22, 1924 at Boston bringing together the Armenian Federation of the Workers Party with the Armenian Social Democratic Huntchakist group. The Armenian section was placed on a 3 month probationary period and began operating as an integral part of the WPA in June.
