Although it has been proved and admitted in court that the International Harvester company is a monopoly in the meaning of United States, and possesses the power to fix farm machinery prices regardless of the interests of the farmers, this trust was given a clean bill of health and will continue to do business under full sanction and protection of the law, by a decision of the Supreme Court of the United States this week.

In its ruling, written by Justice Sanford, the Supreme Court as-serts that "the law does not make the mere size of a corpora-tion, however impressive, or the existence of uneverted power on its part, an offense, when unac-companied by unlawful conduct in the exercise of its power," and also "the fact that competitors may see proper, in the exercise of their own judgement, to follow the prices of another manufac-turer, does not establish any suppression of competition or show any sinister domination.

This amazing interpretation legalizes all price-fixing "understandings" and "gentlemanly agreements" be-tween firms. It is practically an invitation to the members of a line of trade or manufacture to go ahead and agree on prices, and a promiso that they can count on the support of the courts.

LONDON, June, 11 .- War methods are expected to be revolutionized by experiments with mechanized military units being made secretly by the British authorities on the military plain at Salisbury. Training is going on rapidly under new war rules for tactical maneuvers this autumn. If the experiment

proves successful, a division will be organized on the new plan. The object is to create expeditionary forces of fewer men, greater killing power, quicker land movement as Great Britain's experience in sending a defense force to Shanghai led to the energetic study of mechanization

of the brigade. In the new reorganization horses are practically eliminated. Horses are only used by brigade and battalion commanders, and are to be transported in special armored motor horse boxes. Infantry travels in special, six wheeled trucks with armor plate protection. A whole brigade can be moved on the roads at twenty miles an hour, kitchens keeping pace, and at twelve miles an hour across country for fighting units, when tractor wheels replace the ordinary wheels.

Farms Taxed Third of Total Profits

New York, June 13 - During the last three years agriculture in the United States paid taxes umounting to 33.1 per cent of its net profits, the national industrial onference board announces.

A study made by the board dis-

closes that in proportion to agriculture's net profits taxes paid on farms during that period averaged nearly three times more than in the last three prewar years. During 1912, 1913 and 1914 taxes absorbed an average of 11.2 per cent of the total net farm profits, the eport said.

"How acute a crisis American agriculture has passed through in recent years." the report says, "is reflected in the fact that in 1920-21 taxes collected from farms amounted to nearly six times the total net profits from all farms. The survey shows taxes levied on agriculture amounted to \$890, 000,000 in 1025-26, as against \$315,000,000 in 1913. In the last crop year net profits were given as \$2,930,000,000, about the same
