During the industrial depression of 1921-'22, the children's bureau of the United States Department of Labor collected some very interesting statistics regarding the effect of unemployment on the welfare of the children.

In transmitting the report to Secretary of Labor Davis, Grace Abbott, chief of the children's bureau, said: "Large groups of children suffer, not from temporary, but permanent unemployment, as a result of industrial depression. Those who are interested in raising the standard of our citizenship better understand the situation in this country than can regard us outside the field of their concern proposals for providing a high standard of living for the children of the unemployed."
