In the investigation of the court, Kinderman and his associates were interrogated and corroborated essentially the account of the Communist Party as set forth in the preliminary examination.

The alleged scientific purpose of the trip was to be carried out by the court as a scientific and "historical" study of the German people, not to speak of Communists, with genetic research in mind. The trip was to be undertaken without fear, without making any distinction between the German people as a fact that the members of the court had to explain the elaborate arrangements in the case of the possibility of arrest.
