# DETROIT POLICE KILLED BREINER DURING RIOTING?

## Patrolman Admits He Fired Two Shots

(Special to The Daily Worker)  
DETROIT, Nov. 24.—During the riotous trial of the slain Negro and 30 confederates for the alleged murder of Dr. Martin Luther King, a patrolman admitted that he fired two shots at the crowd on the night of the riot.

The patrolman was forced to admit on cross-examination that he had fired two shots at one of the Negro residents whom he saw on the upper rear porch. Dr. Drew admitted that he had a number of pistols in the house and also a shotgun. In order to defend himself, if it were necessary, since he had been threatened by an organization of white landlords who threaten him with death if he did not sell his new house to them and leave the neighborhood, but that on the night that Breiner was slain that none of the occupants of the house had fired the shot.

The defense had a photographer come before the trial with a number of photographs to show that Breiner could not have been killed by a shot fired from the house but that the patrolman, who admits firing at the house, must have slain Breiner.

Police Shot Breiner?  
The photographer, Stephen Pickett, introduced a number of pictures which show the possibility that the patrolman may have slain Breiner during the rioting.

The police were at the house at the time the shot attempted to make it appear that there had been trouble at the Sweet residence and that the Detroit had purposely shot Breiner. The state in its attempt to convict 11 Negroes for the murder gave a setback when, under cross-examination, the police were forced to admit that they had considerable trouble in dispersing the mob.

# EX-PREMIER BRIAND OF FRANCE FAILS TO GET MAJORITY SUPPORT; QUITS ATTEMPT TO FORM CABINET

(Special to The Daily Worker)

PARIS, France, Nov. 24.—Aristide Briand, eight times premier of France, failed to form a cabinet when requested to do so by President Doumergue. Briand endeavored to form a cabinet by securing promises from the various parties that would enable him to have a substantial majority.

"I am compelled to give up my attempt to form a cabinet," Briand said, as he went to the Chamber of Deputies to answer to the president. "I had hoped to form a cabinet of representatives of all parties, but I am sorry to have to resign, partly accepting its full responsibility, but the socialist refusal to participate made this impossible."

Briand advised that Senator Paul Doumer be asked to resign, take the task. The socialists, who were the mainstay of the Briand cabinet, were not in the attitude of Briand who tries to lose them and create a bloc with the center and right socialists predominating. Briand made an effort to obtain the support of these elements of the cabinet, the supporters of the former Premier Doumer, but failed.

The socialists thus refused to participate in the cabinet unless they had half the portfolio colonial policy of the cabinet. Under Briand the colonial policy of the cabinet was brutal exploitation of the natives of the colonies and mandated areas. It was while the national socialist, Herriot, was premier that the British, General Starbuck, was dispatched to Syria. Doumer may succeed.

Acting on the suggestion of Briand, the president announced Senator Paul Doumer as premier and formed a cabinet. Doumer is expected for 34 hours to consider the matter. That means that within the next twenty-four hours Doumer will confer with various party leaders but try to reach an agreement whereby he can be assured a majority in the Chamber of Deputies. Doumer announced that if he accepted he would act as prime minister and keep Briand as foreign minister.

Communists Active.  
With no cabinet in existence and the economic life of France in a chaotic condition, with unemployment threatening for the first time since the war, the Communists are taking advantage of the upheaval and carrying on an intense agitation in the proletarian centers.

The hitch in Doumergue and the resultant war in Syria are utilized as the excuse for the Communist agitation. The Communist party can create a stable cabinet in France and assert that elections must be held to elect the president that has been reached. They state that no matter what sort of artificial agreement may be made to prolong the present cabinet, the existing antagonisms are bound to destroy it.

In the second sector Slovakia, the returns are as follows: Rev. Mikulas's party, 47,000; new Communist party, 15,000; Social Democrats, 10,000; Magyar clerical, 10,000; non-Communist, 4,000; total 92,000 votes, according to the official returns. The social-democrats in this election got 1,250,000 votes.

Organized on Shop Basis.  
The Czechoslovak Communist party which was able to make its showing in the recent parliamentary elections, has now organized on a shop basis prior to this election and is active in the new form of organization to gain the support of great masses of workers in Czechoslovakia.

RUSS CHEMICAL TRUST BY DRUG MACHINERY

'Chemog' Will Spend \$1,700,000 in America

By the Daily Worker. NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—Orders for factory equipment amounting to over \$1,700,000 are being placed by the 'Chemog' trust by the president of the first branch of the trust, Alexander K. Kirilov, vice-president of the branch of the Silesia Industries 'Produce' trust, which is at present in the country. (Governor is accompanied by a staff of the national and technical experts.)

Prior to his arrival in this country Govoroff spent some time in Europe where he placed orders for the sum of about \$2,000,000 mostly in Germany and Belgium. Here, as in Europe, the trust "has begun interest to purchase machinery for the production of chemicals, chemicals in Soviet Russia, and also in building up the production of chemicals within the year.

Govoroff controls the chemical, glass, and allied industries in the Ukraine and Southern Russia. The trust's annual output of its factories amounts to \$27,000,000. It provides for its production facilities as they are available. It controls the production of machinery to increase its production.
