FRENCH ARREST MINOR: CHARGES NOT DIVULGED.

Well Known Cartoonist Seized After Attending Paris Workers' Meeting.

(N.Y. Call) PARIS, June 11.—Robert Minter, well known cartoonist and editor of the New York World and the New York Mirror, was arrested here today following his attendance at a meeting of the Communist Party of America in Paris.

Minter's arrest was kept secret and was revealed only after Lincoln Steffens, an American correspondent, had requested Colonel Lemaire to make it public.

Minter came to France recently from Germany. Earlier in the year he was in Russia and succeeded in obtaining several interviews with Lenin, which were published in New York news papers.

Minter was not heard of for some months afterward, until the New York World reported with a series of articles that he had returned to New York. He did not, it is reported, see the Bohemian editor in Paris, but he did see the Bohemian editor in New York, where he was being radicalized again.
